# **NOTES:**

This session is based on the session from *Charism 2000*, entitled AAflame with the Spirit@. The theme is that we are called to be apostles of conversion. Conversion demands a radical choice for Christ, and is ongoing and total. Conversion has an individual dimension, but also a communal one.

# WELCOME

# **OPENING PRAYERB Prayer of St. Alphonsus to the Holy Spirit**

**Experience:** In the large group, read aloud

- ■The sections of Constitutions 11 & 12 which the group was given at the end of the last gathering
- = The quote from the Circular Letter of St. Alphonsus (July 29, 1774B attached). Give a copy of this to each person.

**Reflection:** In the light of this selection from the writings of St. Alphonsus, and from the Redemptorist Constitutions and Statutes, upon which the group has reflected since our last gathering:

- Share with the group a personal experience of conversion and Aplentiful redemption.@
- Share an experience of conversion/redemption in which you have participated as Aan apostle of conversion.@

Generalization: Proclaim 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

In the large group, discuss:

- 1. What in this text resonates with your own sense of mission?
- 2. What does being Aan ambassador for Christ@ mean for you?
- 3. As Aministers of reconciliation@, how do we bring reconciliation to divided families and communities in our region?

#### Action:

Give people time to reflect individually on the following question, then discuss as a group:

- How can we, as individuals and as a group, stay Aaflame with the apostolic spirit@ to draw people Afirmly and gently to a continuing and total conversion@?

#### **PRAYER**

Ritual Action: Give each person a taper candle. Have each one come forward and light their taper from the group candle in the centre of beauty. Stand in a circle, holding the lit candles, until all the candles are lit. You may wish to have some reflective music playing in the background as this is happening.

When all the candles are lit, the leader says:

Will you be faithful to prayer?

All answer: I will.

L. Will you serve one another in the believing community?

All: I will.

Will you be an ambassador for Christ, proclaiming and living L.

reconciliation?

All: I will.

Thanks be to God! Let us pray together. L.

The prayer below is on an attached sheet, to be photocopied for each participant.

# From the Redemptorist Constitutions and Statutes:

- Art. 3: The Purpose of the Missionary Work
- 11. Blessed by God with the ministry of reconciliation (cf. 2 Cor. 5:18), the members announce the good news of salvation and the "favourable time" (2 Cor. 6:2), so that people be converted, believe in the Gospel (cf. Mark 1:15), really live their baptism and put on the new self (cf. Eph. 4:24).

Redemptorists are thus "apostles of conversion", in so far as the chief object of their preaching is to lead people to a radical choice regarding their life - a decision for Christ-and draw them firmly and gently to a continuing and total conversion. 9

12. The conversion of the individual, however, is brought about in the ecclesial community. And therefore the object of their whole missionary activity is to raise up and develop communities that will walk worthily in the vocation to which they are called, and exercise the priestly, prophetic and royal offices with which God has endowed them.

The missionaries lead those who have been converted to share fully in redemption which is at work in the liturgy, especially in the sacrament of reconciliation, where the Good News of God's mercy in Christ is so wonderfully proclaimed and celebrated, but most of all in the Eucharist through which the Church is built up. 10

In this way the Christian community becomes the sign of God's presence in the world. For, nourished by the word of God, it bears witness to Christ and continually passes with him to the Father in the mystery of the Eucharist. As a result, it walks in love, aflame with the apostolic spirit.
